

# C17 locomotive number 971 update



Well it's been a long time since our loco last pulled a train. The main hold-up has been with the axle box refurbishment, the units have been sent from one engineering works to another involving endless delays at every stage.

Meanwhile many jobs have been undertaken in our yard, including the complete re-paint seen above.

As you probably know, sister locomotive number 974 has been hauling our trips over the past few months.

974 is now returning home to the Queensland Rail Heritage depot at Ipswich, where it will be undergoing a major service itself.

The fire season looks like being pretty bad this year, so we would almost certainly have been prevented from running steam between now and Christmas anyway.

Here's hoping our own fully restored loco will be back on the rails for the start of 2024!
